

New School Library at Middlewich

Our site team at Middlewich have helped to renovate an ageing I.T. room into a state of the art library at the local Middlewich Primary School. The works were extra to the contracted works and formed part of our CSR Initiatives in the North West.

Working with over 15 subcontractors with an estimated investment of over £6,000 by our supply chain, the old I.T. room has seen an amazing transformation which included a new floor, replastered and repainted walls, rewiring and installation of all electrics, new bookcases, desks and chairs.

The 'Willowmere' library officially opened its door to pupils on Friday 12th September as local Mayor P.J. Edwards and Lady Mayoress Sonya Edwards officiated the ceremony, alongside headmistress Sandie La Porta and staff from our site team Keith Huntington and Frank Newby.

Under the supervision of Keith Huntington and Frank Newby, four of Middlewich Primary School's year 5 pupils were asked to help design the brand new library. The children met regularly with the team and teachers, exchanging drawings of how they thought the library should look considering both design and colour co-ordination. The designs were then combined to create a final plan and work was completed over the summer holiday period.

Sandie La Porta, head teacher at Middlewich Primary School, said: "The transformation of our old I.T. suite into a library has been fantastic. This is an addition to the school that will benefit students for many years to come.
